But you know you've truly become a Dad when you your child comes to you and says, "I'm hungry" and you reply, "Hi Hungry, I'm Dad!"






Literacy Spot

Rosenshine's Principles of Instruction

1. The first principle presented is 'Daily Review'.
2. The second principle is 'New Material in Small Steps'.
3. The third principle is 'Ask Questions'.
4. The fourth principle is 'Provide Models'.
5. The fifth principle is 'Guide Student Practice'.
6. The sixth principle is 'Check for Student Understanding'.

The seventh principle is 'Obtain a High Success Rate'.




At the end of a unit teachers will check for understanding and assess student knowledge. 80% is considered to be a high success rate.

A high success rate during guided practice leads to a higher success rate when students are working on problems on their own.

If the success rate is too low we may need to go back and re-teach, re-explain and re-model. Guided practice is then needed, nothing new introduced, just practice.

A high success rate is often gained by teachers teaching in small steps and giving sufficient practice on each part before proceeding to the next step.



As the name and picture suggests, on a building site we need to support the structure in the early stages to stay upright; in a similar way we need to support a student when learning is happening. Scaffolds are there temporarily, they support the development of the learning and then are taken away when the student does not need them anymore. All of the ideas in the 4th principle – Provide Models – can be used as temporary scaffolds that are later withdrawn. A differing real world example of a scaffold is training wheels when a child is riding a bike. They are used for a short period of time while the child learns to balance and then are taken away when they are no longer needed.

Teachers use the following strategies as scaffolds in the classroom: modelling the steps, thinking aloud as the problem is being solved, cue cards, checklists, providing an example of part of the task completed so students can compare their work. These strategies are not used all of the time, only at the beginning, and are then taken away once the student's skill level is transitioning to the mastering stage.

Scaffolding sets a student up for success and setting the student up for success is all part of teaching in a meaningful way!


